* The number currently reflects Garfield RE-2 and Garfield 16 school districts only; we are following up with Roaring Fork School District and Aspen School District to gather data for the current school year.

** This indicator was sourced from the Gallup Student Poll, which was implemented in our region's school districts with ACF's input. Since 2015, Colorado schools have used the Healthy Kids Colorado Survey (HKCS) instead. HKCS does not have a "hope" indicator but does include a number of questions about mental health.

*** Only 4 of the region's 9 high schools have provided the information for this data point so far. We are continuing to work with counselors in the remaining schools for a comprehensive picture for the current school year.
