# HISTORY LEARNING SCHOLARSHIP TRAVEL OPPORTUNITY NATIONAL WWII MUSEUM'S NORMANDY ACADEMY

Paul D. Bushong established the Normandy and WWII Education Fund at Aspen Community Foundation to promote youth understanding of the significance of the Battle of Normandy in WWII. Partial scholarships are available in 2024 for up to 10 students to attend the National World War II Museum's Normandy Academy's educational tour from New Orleans to Paris and Normandy, France.



# **Scholarship & Eligibility Requirements:**

- Must be a current 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade student enrolled at Basalt, Roaring Fork, Bridges, Yampah Mountain, Glenwood Springs, or Coal Ridge high schools.
- All students must be 15 years or older by June 25, 2024.
- Tour dates are June 25 July 5, 2024
- All students must have a valid passport for international travel.
- This scholarship provides \$4,595 per accepted student to cover the full tuition cost of \$5,795. If accepted, students will need to pay \$1,200 to ACF for their portion of the tuition cost.
- All students are expected to fulfill post-trip requirements as scholarship recipients.
