COVID Response

ACF has led community response efforts for the COVID-19 pandemic to help individuals and families impacted by the crisis. This included working with nonprofits, government and schools to coordinate assistance and outreach, engaging donors to support needs, and disbursing funding for critical services.

Like many of our partners, ACF jumped into action to help those impacted by the pandemic. We hosted weekly convenings with dozens of nonprofit organizations, health and human service agencies, school districts, food pantries and others to identify specific needs and coordinate the community response efforts. We worked with a group of donors on the 2020 Rescue Fund to tap into the Aspen area's great generosity to help those impacted by the health and financial crisis. We also launched the COVID-19 Regional Response Fund to channel contributions to those organizations on the front lines of the response efforts.

WMR COAD

As a result of the pandemic and other natural disasters impacting our region, ACF has been leading efforts to create a structure for community organizations to respond more effectively and efficiently to disasters in the future. Beginning in February 2022, ACF convened more than 40 nonprofit organizations, government agencies and emergency managers to explore the role community-based organizations play in disaster response. The result of these convenings was the creation of the West Mountain Regional Community Organizations Active in Disasters (COAD).

The COAD brings together nonprofit, faith-based, voluntary and government organizations to foster a more effective response to the disaster-related needs of people in Pitkin, Eagle and Garfield counties. The COAD's goal is to organize and deploy community resources in an efficient and timely manner, thus enhancing the community's ability to mitigate, prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from disasters.

COAD is an umbrella organization of existing organizations that assist emergency responders, government agencies and community members in times of disasters. Each member organization maintains its own identity and independence, yet works closely with others to improve service, maximize resources and eliminate unnecessary duplication.



CRADLE TO CAREER









CRADLE TO CAREER

Cradle to Career has been Aspen Community Foundation's strategy for accelerating the wellbeing of children and families, particularly those living in poverty, in the Aspen to Parachute region. By aligning activities around a set of agreed-upon goals, using metrics to make decisions and determine progress, and identifying and implementing best practices, we have improved outcomes for children throughout the region.

ACF actively engages community leaders to listen and learn and explore effective approaches for improving outcomes for children by using data and research, strengthening networks and collaboration, and building community investment in youth success. Together with partners we are building a region of thriving youth, supported families, and healthy communities.

Cradle to Career is comprised of four focus areas. Each focus area has key levers that represent the multi-pronged approach needed to "level the playing field" for many of our low-income and under-resourced children and families.

SECURE THE START

Supporting the healthy development and kindergarten readiness of children, prenatal to age 5.

ENVISION THE FUTURE

Supporting the academic success and college and career readiness of students, kindergarten through 12th grade.











THRIVING YOUTH

Supporting the social emotional wellbeing, health, and resiliency of children and families.

SAFETY NET

Supporting basic human needs and a more just and resilient community.

SECURE THE START

Secure the Start partners work across four key levers in the early childhood space: increasing home visits to at-risk parents; boosting the quality of family, friends and neighbor (FFN) care; expanding access to licensed childcare; and developing local, sustainable funding for early care and education. In 2022, ACF worked with two partners to improve the capacity and skills of adults caring for children through home visiting and FFN care. We invested in a pilot project to provide direct cash assistance and mental health support for 20-25 FFN providers in the region. And we supported and participated in the Confluence Early Childhood Education Coalition to advance a ballot initiative in support of early care and education funding.

3

THRIVING YOUTH

Thriving Youth partners are focused on ensuring the health and wellbeing of youth and families, providing interventions and support for at-risk youth and addressing equity and inclusion so that youth feel safe and supported. In 2022, this included increasing school-based physical and mental health resources, expanding services that are bilingual/bicultural, supporting programs addressing youth substance use, and continued support of school district family resource centers.

ENVISION THE FUTURE

Envision the Future partners address the key levers of college and career readiness, including academic support and enrichment, career exploration, experiential learning, and postsecondary planning. In 2022, ACF relaunched the college and career counselor network with representatives from all four regional school districts to support non-college bound students. We created a career technical education provider network in order to increase career exploration and work-based learning opportunities for high school students. And we invested in Youthentity's High Five Your Life pilot, a career discovery and financial planning tool and workshop series that helps students make informed decisions about their futures.

SAFETY NET

Safety Net was created to recognize that, along with developmental and educational strategies, other social determinants play a key role in whether children and families thrive. Safety Net partners provide children and families with essential human services including food, shelter, safety, immigrant rights support, community integration, and creating a more resilient community. In 2022, ACF supported coalitions developing regional solutions for food security and homelessness and supported organizations providing critical services for families experiencing hardship, isolation, and injustice.

ULTIMATE SKI PASS

Front and center on its website's home page, Aspen Skiing Company (SkiCo) announces itself as "Four mountains, two towns, and one unforgettable experience at the confluence of nature, culture, and recreation." While that is no doubt what they are best known for, it doesn't capture the bigger role the company aspires to play in our local communities.

At Aspen Community Foundation (ACF), we've been a partner in those efforts for almost as long as we've been around. In fact, it's how we came to exist. In 1980, SkiCo founded the organization that would go on to become ACF. The organizations have been separate entities since the mid-1980s, but at the heart of the partnership is a joint commitment to supporting the people and places in our region that can be negatively impacted by the very prominence and desirability — and the subsequent costs of housing, health care, and child care — that are at the center of SkiCo's business.

SkiCo acknowledges that a motivator behind its commitment to fighting climate change and helping build thriving communities is, in part, to "stay in business forever." Without snow, there is no skiing. Without quality schools, affordable places to live, and a healthy, connected local population, there's less appeal for employees to make a life here. Even worse, as our problems multiply, the sustainability of the whole region can become tenuous. So together we try to address as much of it as we can.

Aspen Community Foundation and SkiCo have offered iterations of a philanthropic pass program for decades. In 2012, we launched the \$25,000 Ultimate Ski Pass, which directs all proceeds to youth-serving nonprofits in the region.

The Ultimate Ski Pass has generated **\$5.4 million for the community** through grants and support to nonprofits.

Partnering with regional nonprofits and other organizations allows the foundation and SkiCo to activate solutions in real time, directing philanthropic dollars to the places where they will have the greatest impact. For example, funding from the Ultimate Ski Pass helped pilot two preschool-on-wheels buses which were specifically designed to offer early childhood education to low-income children who otherwise might not have access. Countless other initiatives and organizations have benefited from the passes' support.

According to SkiCo's Senior Manager of Sustainability and Philanthropy Hannah Berman, "the Ultimate Ski Pass is an example of how thoughtful partnerships, creative brand leveraging, and education on community issues, can tie recreation to purpose — the very core of the Aspen Idea".

As the Ultimate Ski Pass enters its second decade, we at the foundation would like to celebrate the partnership and thank the donors who have purchased passes over the years.







YOUTH IN NATURE

In 2021, the Jonathan D + Mark C. Lewis Foundation (JDMCLF) approached Aspen Community Foundation (ACF) with the idea of developing a nature-focused youth empowerment program for local high school students.

In response, ACF convened community leaders from environmental education, recreation, stewardship. and mentoring organizations to learn about their programs and explore possibilities for addressing service gaps through a collaborative initiative. During conversations, the group expressed an interest in deepening their engagement with teens from across the region through longer, cohort model programs. This model would complement their shorter programs that are often attended by a changing roster of participants. They also identified barriers that have prevented high schoolers from participating in existing outdoor programs, including a lack of transportation, conflicts with academic, family, athletic, and work commitments, and difficulty accessing outdoor gear.

Following discussions, Roaring Fork Outdoor Volunteers (RFOV), Aspen Center for Environmental Sciences (ACES), Farm Collaborative, Aspen Valley Land Trust, Buddy Program, and Aspen Skiing Company committed to working together to cocreate and lead a program that has become Youth in Nature.

Youth in Nature (YIN) is a year-long empowerment program that connects high school students from across our region with new people, places, and outdoor professionals. It combines elements of nature, mental and physical health, stewardship, and

community building. It introduces outdoor career paths and provides students with opportunities for expanded engagement with partners via volunteerism, internships, and participation in programs hosted by the nonprofits (beyond Youth in Nature activities).

Made possible through the generosity of the Jonathan D + Mark C. Lewis Foundation, Youth in Nature launched in June of 2022. 10th-12th graders from Aspen to Parachute schools were recruited to participate in the pilot that included an orientation, wilderness hut trip, and eight Saturday sessions taking place during the school year. In response to the participation barriers identified during the planning process, YIN is free-of-cost and provides students with transportation, gear, and an educational award. The program's format and year-long time frame accommodates the scheduling needs of most participants and deepens engagement between students and nonprofit partners.

Ben Sherman, RFOV education director has observed students who came into the program with hesitancy have since bonded with peers and meaningful connections have developed within the group over time. He also shared that YIN "has been a great opportunity for everyone in the group to offer peer mentorship during the program." YIN has not only strengthened the bonds between students, it has also allowed partners to connect in new ways and see each other as collaborators, ultimately strengthening our community on another level.

Lewis.

GIVING NETWORK

In 2016, Aspen Community Foundation established the Cradle to Career Giving Network, with the support of Laura and Gary Lauder, as a dynamic initiative to foster positive change in the lives of children and families across the Aspen to Parachute region. This network not only enables philanthropists to make a tangible impact but also offers a platform for mutual learning and awareness among peers. Each member contributes a minimum of \$5,000 annually, generating substantial collective resources. Since its inception, the Cradle to Career Giving Network has channeled over \$1,000,000 in investments towards enhancing youth outcomes in crucial areas such as kindergarten readiness, youth social and emotional well-being, and post-high school success.

Members of the Cradle to Career Giving Network convene multiple times throughout the year to engage with experts and practitioners directly involved in the region's youth and family support systems. This collaborative environment allows them to examine data, dissect challenges, and explore potential solutions. Through in-depth discussions and interactions with nonprofit organizations, they collectively strategize on effective ways to address pressing issues. The decisive culmination of these deliberations is the annual allocation of pooled funds, directed towards initiatives that promise the most significant impact.

The Giving Network's Chair, Ramona Bruland's initial motivation to join was to better comprehend the challenges affecting children in the region, and she found herself deeply moved by the camaraderie within the group. The wealth of philanthropic expertise that members contribute and the seamless involvement in impactful philanthropy astounded her.

Everyone is so busy that taking on something else can feel overwhelming, but the Giving Network provides easy access to compassionate philanthropy, connection to peers and is extremely rewarding," said Bruland.

The Cradle to Career Giving Network's journey continued in 2022 with a growing understanding of the profound ramifications of the pandemic on student mental health, overall well-being, academic achievement, and family stability. Members took a proactive stance, continuing support for organizations that played pivotal roles in assisting youth and families as they navigated the multifaceted impacts of COVID-19. These efforts included extending aid to the region's four family resource centers, bolstering nonprofits offering school-based mental health services, facilitating parent education and coaching, and providing bilingual/bicultural therapy services.


